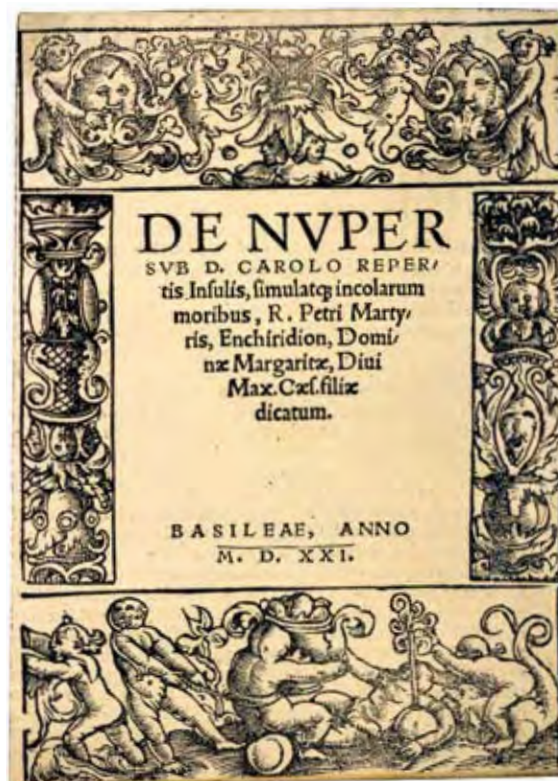

Pietro Martire d'Anghiera (Peter Martyr of Angleria) was the first historian of America. *Opus Epistolarum* is a collection of his correspondence with the most knowledgeable persons of his time. He was a confidant of Columbus, Vasco da Gama, Hernando Cortés, Ferdinand Magellan, Sebastian Cabot, and Amerigo Vespucci, among others.

In 1770 Muñoz was appointed cosmographer of the Council of the Indies. King Charles III commanded him to write a general history of America in 1779, but the Council of the Indies opened their archives reluctantly and the viceroys of South America refused to communicate official documents that proved frequent abuses of authority over the Indians, which it was in their interest to conceal. Muñoz tried his best to overcome all difficulties and made several voyages to South America for the purpose. He composed only the first part of his intended work, the publication of which was prohibited by the Council of the Indies, but Charles IV interposed his authority and the work was printed.
